

Getting the Most out of Virtual VBS

We're all going to miss many of the aspects of VBS that just can't be replicated in an online version, but hopefully, the week can still be a fun and profitable time for your children. Here are some suggestions towards that end.

1. If possible, watch the videos with your children. <https://faithfpc.org/ministries/vbs/parables/>
2. Encourage them to participate by singing along, saying the memory verses, and doing the craft. You may have them get their Bibles out and look up the passages where the parables are found. For the craft, be sure you have downloaded the "VBS Craft Supplies" pdf from the church website. It lists not only the items the children will need to make the craft but also patterns you will need to print out.

3. Pause the video.

Take breaks. Each video will be approximately one hour long. That's a long time to expect a child to sit still. During normal VBS, the children get breaks for games outside and for snacks. There's no reason you can't do the same thing at home. Hit the pause button and let them go outside to play for a while. And don't forget some snacks!

Pause to pray. At the end of each "Mission Trip" segment, the video suggests two things to pray about for the missionary featured that day. Pause the video and take a minute to pray with the children for those missionaries, and, as the week goes on, for the ones mentioned on earlier days as well.

Time to be artistic. You may find it helpful to pause the video during the craft time while your child works on the various steps.

4. Use the "Digging Deeper" sheets below to encourage your child to think about what he or she has heard. Choose the questions you use according to your child's age, ability, and interests. You could go over the questions at the end of the day's video or do it section by section. Note: An answer key is included at the end of the pdf.

If your children enjoy answering the questions, consider using a chart on which they can check off having completed each day's sheet. You could add blanks for learning the memory verses as well and offer some kind of prize at the end of the week.

5. Incorporate what the children are learning this week into your family devotions. Help them memorize the Bible verses. Perhaps sing some of the songs together (words to the songs in the VBS videos are included on pages 12 and 13 of this pdf).
6. Send us pictures! Send us pictures (info@faithfpc.org) of your children participating in VBS (singing the songs, listening to the story, working on the craft). We'll post as many of them as we can on the church's Facebook page. You don't have to include the children's faces. Take pictures from behind or just show their hands as they work on or hold their craft. (Please be aware that any pictures you send may be posted on Faith FPC's Facebook page and/or the church website. We will assume that you are giving us permission to do so.)

 - A. What did Joshua do with these stones? **Answer: Joshua built a monument (memorial) to the fact that God worked miracles to bring His people to the land He had promised to them.**
 - B. Why did God want Joshua to do this? **Answer: When children asked why the stones were there, God wanted them to be told the story of the miracles He had done.**
2. TRUE OR FALSE: Miracles described in the Bible, like the walls of Jericho falling down and five loaves and two fish feeding 5,000 people, are fantasy because they could not really happen. **Answer: False. The miracles in the Bible did happen. God works miracles to teach us that He is the all-powerful God.**
3. Normally when a story contains anthropomorphisms, like talking animals, it is fantasy. But the story of Balaam's talking donkey is not fantasy. Why do we know it is not fantasy?
Simple Answer: (appropriate for young children) It is in the Bible. If this answer is used by older children, consider probing a bit in order to achieve the better answer. Remind them that the Bible records people's lies and that the cedar/thistle fable spoken about in our first lesson is not a true story.
Better Answer: Because God worked a miracle, opening the donkey's mouth, in order to teach Balaam (and us) spiritual lessons.

3. Give an example of a fantasy story. **Answer: Cinderella, Snow White, Three Billy Goats Gruff, etc.**
4. Give an example of a fiction story that is not a fantasy story (if you can't think of an example, make one up). **Answer: The story of Bob and his father studying eagles (told in the video). Other answers are possible. If you need to prompt them to make up a story, ask them to make up a story about something they could have done yesterday that they really did not do.**
5. TRUE OR FALSE (*for older children*): All fantasy stories are fiction, but not all fiction stories are fantasy. Explain your answer by defining *fantasy* and *fiction*. **Answer: True. Fiction stories are not true. Fantasy (fairy tales) have make-believe elements (fairies, dragons, time travel, etc.), which makes them not true and thus are fiction. But a fiction story does not have to contain make-believe (fantasy) elements.**

Parable: The Prodigal Son (Luke 15:11–32)

3. TRUE OR FALSE: When a person hears a story, he always understands the lesson or message the story is communicating. **Answer: False. Some stories are difficult to understand and must be explained to the listener. (Examples: Christ had to explain the parable of the sower, seed, and soil to the disciples. One may hear a fable or read a story and not think about it enough to even see the meaning of the story.)**
4. TRUE OR FALSE: A good story is always interesting or exciting. **Answer: False. Stories that a person does not find interesting or exciting may teach valuable lessons. Many interesting and exciting**

stories teach bad messages and must be considered bad stories. A truly good story is interesting and/or exciting enough to engage the listener and also teaches a good lesson.
